Description of the site and its surroundings Which aspects of the site are being assessed? Accessibility for disabled children.							
First impressions of the site Include first impressions about the site, including location, hazards, overall look and feel, for example: does it look and feel friendly? Park has off road parking, including disabled parking bays. Most of the park has wheelchair accessible paths. Near London Road, there is a wheelchair accessible roundabout and a climbing frame which would be accessible for light wheelchairs (there is some pushing required to get from one section to another). The netball pitch would be accessible with a lower net and replacing the short run up with paving instead of							
gravel.  Near Wokingham Road, there are several bucket swings for those that can transfer without a hoist, and a table tennis table. There is a wheelchair accessible café, with a toilet suitable for wheelchairs, and an accessible library.							
The site is not suitable for children who might run off as there is no fencing round the play equipment near London Road and several unsecured swing gates at the Wokingham road end. The site is large with 2 busy main roads.							
There is plenty of space and a wide variety of equipment for those without physical disabilities.  Parents report that children have loved playing in the park and although some autistic children have it a bit overwhelming. "One big draw for us has always been that Palmer Park library is so nearby. When the boys were little, we would go to the library and then on to the park and happily spend a few hours at a time there. Even now, when my older son is too overwhelmed to play in the park, he is old enough to go over to the library for a bit of peace while I stay in the park with the younger one." Library staff are very helpful to families.
